A Bible reader locates a verse Find the book, then find the chapter, and finally locate the number that the verse is associated with. Bible verses are expressed in numbers, or sometimes with Roman numerals. For example, locating John 3:16 requires that the reader first find John's book in the Bible. This is possible by locating the Bible table of contents, which is usually found in the first pages of the Bible. The table shows the page number on which the first chapter of John is located. When the reader turns to the first chapter of John, he must find Chapter 3. Chapter numbers are usually in larger type than the main text. When locating chapter 3, the reader must then look up verse number 16. The verse numbers are the same size as the main text, but usually in a bolder type. References to the Bible sometimes do not refer to just a whole verse. For example, a reader can find a reference to John 3:16-21; this requires him to start reading at number 16 and stop when he reaches number 22. Another format of Bible reference is John 3:16, 22. This means that the reader first reads verse 16 and then skips to verse 22. Another type of reference is John 3:16a. When a is used, it means that the reader only needs to read the first part of the verse, while a b leads the reader to the second part of the verse.
